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“Our main focus is to take our guests back in time because we want them to feel like they are actually stuck inside a 1980’s horror movie nightmare. It’ll be an experience you won’t get anywhere else on Halloween night,” said Cobie Cortez, co-owner of Blue Moon Mondays. “We want our guests to be scared, have fun, and most importantly let their inner freak loose. Our bar is a safe space for anyone and everyone who feels like an outcast to the world.”

Tickets to the freak fest are being sold online for \$20 and will also be available the night of for \$25. Along with the raffle for a pair of passes to the “Stranger Things” season three premiere, there will also be a costume contest judged by the friends of the bar’s owners. The top three winners with the most unique and original costume idea will all receive movie passes to the ArcLight in Hollywood and the first place winner will get an all you can eat, all expense paid breakfast at Blue Moon Mondays’ specialty breakfast Mondays.

In addition to the live performances, Blue Moon Mondays has also booked Echo Park’s favorite DJ, Part Time Punks, who will be spinning the best 1980s hits and Halloween jams all through the night.
